CLUB VISIT TO RADIO 3KND

From the very outset, this was to be the most welcoming of outdoor club meetings. As outlined by 3KND General Manager Rotarian **Gerry Lyons**, the visit was a reversal of the stations 24/7 aim – casting, getting out to persons in all their conditions, wherever they may be and whatever their needs. This visit was of people coming into the station and taking an interest in the station's staff, their roles and challenges.



The <u>visitors</u> were made up of Preston Rotarians, Victorian Police Officers and Darebin Council leaders. For once, the station and its personnel were the subject.

A highlight was to meet with Lorena Walker who, after her arrival from Alice Springs, first met with the club when members helped in the furnishing of her vacant unit with RIMERN goods. Lorena manages outside media; she aids volunteers in their presentations at 3KND and countrywide, and travels to numerous indigenous events throughout the country. Rotarian Erica Higgins as Communications Manager was a welcomer and is passionate that the indigenous voice be heard. Grant Hansen, a Kulin Nation man, was there. Grant has held so many roles in his work for community. Grant's achievements in the field of broadcasting and music and his encouragement of the indigenous voice are spread across many popular radio stations. In many ways, Grant is the voice. In addition, present from Darebin Council was Diego Del Mercato.

Manager Gerry Lyons (pictured above) was strong when speaking of the role of a **broadcaster**. He stressed that the speaker must visualise speaking to the audience as if face-to-face. The consumer wants to see the speaker. It must be a family relationship. It must be person to person welcome as against closed dictation. The listener must feel acknowledged.

All broadcasters at 3KNd are **volunteers** while maybe at the same time professional technicians.

A horrified gasp came from Gerry's listeners when he spoke of the waves of distressing racial abuse his staff received. They came from persons at the station entrance, through emails or via text. Eventually police had to be made aware and through their constant presence and with all communications being recorded, the abuse has been considerably reduced but, still a reality.

In all, the visit was a great occasion. It was both a marvellous success story for today while remaining a true awakening.
