## ***SPEAKER LAST WEEK***

**ANZAC DAY:** In the opening of his presentation, Professor Stewart McIntyre pointed out that he would discuss MEMORY and the differences of MEMORY.

One hundred years ago when the young men of Northcote, Preston, Coburg and the rest of Australia, made that trip to Anzac Cove ... those who returned and their families .... for all of them ... the Great War ... Gallipoli ... was a living memory. The way they honoured and remembered those events in the following decades is necessarily different from the way they are remembered today. After one hundred years that war now has ceased to be a living memory.

Stewart remembers that, when he was a young school boy in the 1950s, ANZAC Day was a sombre occasion. Veterans only would march along the streets of Melbourne. The others would observe but not participate. Soldiers who had fought and returned would describe a war against a brutal enemy country which failed to observe the rules of war. People who served, including members of Stewart's family, very rarely discussed the experiences they had had on the Western Front. On the contrary, Veterans of the Second World War were more prone to recount their war experiences. For them, this war had more 'moral legitimacy'; it was the war against Hitler, it was the "good war".



In our time, when the Great War is not any more a living memory, those with a link to the soldiers who lost their lives at ANZAC Cove take that link very seriously. They identify strongly with those ancestors. Pilgrimages of young Australians to Turkey for the Dawn Service on Anzac Day have become increasingly popular; so much so that a ballot was needed to allocate places at the centenary service this year.

However, it is important that young Australians see the big picture of that war. It is important that they know that the landing - at ANZAC Cove - half way along the Gallipoli Peninsula - was in support of the main assault at its southern tip - that there were many more British and French troops than ours and that Senegalese and Indian units were also part of the French and British troops. It is important for the young people of today to understand that, one hundred years ago, Australians and New Zealanders were fighting to assist the ally.

The soldiers who served at Anzac Cove were young men from all walks of life, good characters as well as bad. They were all plunged into a dreadful ordeal and the toll of the war was devastating. It is correct that we honour and commemorate them. However when we commemorate them let's also remember that ANZAC day was above all a tragic and traumatic experience, whose lessons we should not forget.

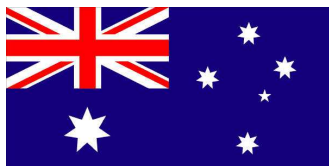
