ROTARIAN BEHIND THE BADGE

JOE MORRIS J.P. was the speaker and, as usual, members were keen to hear the life-story of a relatively new member. Before Joe spoke, wife of 42 years, Julie, remarked she was on her seat's edge given that Joe had not run the story past Julie!


Born in 1941 in Bolton, he has vivid childhood memories of German bombers flying over on their way to bomb industrial Manchester 15kms away. In 1949 it was off to Australia where his dad had previously lived for 5 years.



Leaving school in 1957 there followed a chain of employments - ES&A Bank, Bureau of Meteorology, Taxation Department and Department of Immigration (Passports). Joe was involved in the Scouts and the Young Christian Workers and one day responded to a notice board info on a 2 year Diploma in Youth Leadership. His first job after that was 2 years managing the newly formed Try Youth and Community Services in West Heidelberg. Then in 1970 he was the Youth Liaison Officer at the Broadmeadows City council. This was an earth-shaking step as it was there that in his work capacity he met an official of the YWCA in Glenroy, partner Julie. They are now parents of three adult children.

Passing over a few short moves it was then to Good Shepherd Youth Services where he was a co-founder of No Interest Loans Scheme for low income people and a secondary school for those who do not fit into the normal education structure. Then it was to be CEO of the Victorian Association of Youth in Communities supporting 100 youth clubs throughout the state.

While the above are of Joe's some occupations the years have involved his setting up of new facilities and for opportunities youth. An example is seen during the 1990s when he was involved with youth painting graffiti. With government funds youth were shown legal sites where they could display their work. They were supplied with paint as against



stealing it. The result was that they did not get a criminal record and many have gone on to be professionals in the world of art and design one being a finalist twice in the Archibald Competition. (Photo - of Joe with artist, Rose Street, Fitzroy.)


Joe still works 3 days a week - Aboriginal Support Network, Minus 18 (the young Gay and Lesbian group) and to Ygender (a young transgender group).
