

ROTARY OVERSEAS RECYCLING PROGRAMME: Speaker **Bob Allardice** is a Nunawading Rotarian, a retired engineer and specialized problem solver and a leader in the RORP. Founded about 5 years it is now spread over 3 Rotary Districts, RORP is still evolving. Due to both ageing and regular updating of permit requirements the regular renewals of 15-20 year-old playgrounds ending up in the local tip or landfill. Enter RORP and its operation:

- RORP relocates Aussie playgrounds in third world countries
- It is cost neutral for Rotary and clubs
- In these recent years over 100 have been relocated overseas
- Countries include Sri Lanka 56, Nepal 10, Philippines 10, Tanzania 1, Timor 3, PNG 4 and Fiji 1.



The sources of the equipment include councils, education groups, clubs, private members and manufacturers. The involvement of Rotary clubs sees members identifying the playgrounds, inspecting and photographing, marking and labelling, contacting a contractor and attending and coordinating the harvesting. Contractors play a large part especially underground works.

Bob's presentation ended with an invitation to members or the club to be involved in whatever manner. Always there are other clubs with previous experience are willing to cooperate.




CLUB NEWS
