SPEAKER LAST WEEK

INNER NORTH COMMUNITY FOUNDATION: A Rotary Exchange Student in 1999 to Brazil, **Ben Rodgers** is now the Executive Officer of the INCF. Ben comes to the Foundation with 10 years' experience in the not-for-profit sector in Melbourne and overseas.

INCF is an independent community foundation based in Melbourne's Inner North. Its area of interest stretches from Glenroy to Reservoir to Brunswick and across to Northcote.

The Foundation was established in 2007 as an initiative of IntoWork Australia. It manages philanthropic dollars to provide funds for projects that create prosperous, connected, and

cohesive communities in Melbourne's Inner North, particularly encouraging pathways to employment

Ben thanked the Club for its participation in INCF. With speed Ben based his talk on three points: an update on the Fund's activities, the role of Sub Funds and the plans for the future. The Club has a Sub Fund of \$11,800 in INCF.



This year INCF invested in 20 local groups which help the unemployed into employment. It also strives to support resources which can offer more employment. The scope is ever widening. To run the Foundation philanthropy is fostered - families, companies and organizations; hence the Sub Funds. In the end all monies are distributed in the inner north.

Good questions followed, one seemingly showing the need for the Club to be made more aware of the movement of profits derived from the Club's Sub Fund.

CLUB NEWS

KHOI CAO-LAM has sent his latest news from Cambridge University . Khoi has been admitted to St.Edmund's College. As an update, while the Club failed in seeking the Global Grant Scholarship, the District Grant hopefully will be completed shortly, resulting in almost \$10,000 over Khoi's two year course.

YOUTH SUPPORT AND ADVOCACY SERVICE (YSAS): Meghan Becke accepted a cheque from the Club on behalf of YSAS. Meghan said the donation will help purchase services and value cards for their clients. YSAS has an office in Preston.

YSAS is a Victorian state-wide community service. YSAS provides a continuum of services for young people aged between 12 and 21 who are experiencing problems related to alcohol and other drugs. YSAS provides a range of youth-specific outreach, treatment, withdrawal, rehabilitation and support programs in 13 locations across Melbourne and regional Victoria. This includes Indigenous youth-specific services.

YSAS was formed in 1997 by a consortium comprising of the



Centre for Adolescent Health, the Royal Children's Hospital, Jesuit Social Services, St Vincent's Hospital and Turning Point Alcohol and Drug Centre.
