

SPEAKERS LAST WEEK

YMCA - YOUTH FOR CAUSES PROGRAM: Nadine Robinson-Dankert, Ella Hedigan-Dattner, Mikka Jordan, Pascale Larkin and leader Jess Bell-Matsen were the five year 10 Northcote High School students who presented the topic.

The team is in a program which prepares young people to pursue social not-for-profit enterprises for young people in causes they care about. It is an 8 month course and involves business guidance, mentorship and workshop. At this meeting the students explained their selected cause and their guided methodology.



Their chosen cause is that of creating change for sustainability through education and communication. Their base and their ultimate financial beneficiary is Brunswick's Ceres Community Environment Park, which aims at educating through their 5 key areas of sustainability:

- 1. Water Use and Quality
- 2. Energy Use, Climate Change and Renewables
- 3. Waste Reduction and Organic Recycling
- 4. Biodiversity and Sustainable Food Systems
- 5. People, Behaviour Change and Community Engagement

<u>Their methodology</u> is through the sale of 70 or more organic and environmentally friendly T shirts with imprinted messages around behaviour change in the use of environment and sustainability. The shirts will cost around \$14 and will sell for \$30-\$40.

A most memorable statement came towards the end of the presentation: "We want also to make an impact of the kids at our school about environmental issues and the effects of the little things of a day that have a vast effect on our planet".
