

SPEAKER LAST WEEK

Speaker MARY CARAJIAS, introduced by her Rotary counsellor Ruth McCall, has returned home from Taiwan where she studied over the 2020 year as a Rotary Youth Exchange Student. Mary was sponsored by Preston Rotary. Ruth observed that her role as Mary's counsellor was not a task but a totally joyful and rewarding experience. Reservoir to Taiwan, now the resilient Mary is with extended family studying year 11 in Hobart.

Mary's first of 5 family hostings was in Taoyuan County, at the northern tip of Taiwan. Despite no school for her first 5 weeks due to the Coronavirus, that family set the pace for the rest of the year with their a most heartening welcome. Having 5 families as hosts gave Mary a wider experience of culture, lifestyles and friendships.

Taiwan, being on a fault line, earth tremors were the norm with one quake up to the 6.2 level at the epicentre; terrifying but thrilling for a Reservoir girl! Her fellow siblings just kept playing on their mobiles. The 6 months of sticky summer was a real test for her wardrobe.

For Mary, schooling was spread between two campuses — 2 days learning Chinese at the university and three days at the high school. Chinese for her was either traditional or simplified and, seemingly, she mastered both. High school was heavily into culture classes — pottery, food dishes (moon cakes) and visiting Buddhist centres to mention a few. In these studies, she accomplished high scores! Befriending students was very easy given that her school had 6,000 students — Taiwan being so small an island thousands were packed into one school. Her close friends were an enjoyable semi-partying group always keen to be at the centre of festive occasions, travels and local celebrations. With 50 students in her class there was no spare space and 'discipline' was non-existent. Teachers needed microphones. Some students would snooze and others would 'mouth off a lot'; in all, a great joy!

Most evening meals were eaten out as it was cheaper but weight gain was a danger. Once she became accustomed, the food varieties became a true thrill. Sport was extensive and Mary joined a baseball club where she was coached in the various skills with an eventual prize for her good batting. All 10-minute class breaks saw the students playing basketball. Learn-to-swim classes were needed as most students could not swim.

The highlight was the end-of-year 5 day tour around Taiwan bonding with the rest of the exchange students. They explored regions from north to south and virtually did everything.

In short this was one of the most enthusiastic and convincing descriptions of the value of Rotary Youth Exchange. Questions abounded from her animated audience which was fascinated by the abundance of Mary's descriptive new experiences, discoveries and undoubted growth in her personal self-discovery.

Mary was most grateful to the club for the opportunity as also to Ruth McCall for her guidance and companionship.


