SPEAKERS LAST WEEK

With more enthusiasm than a winning team of 18 footballers, <u>Arthur Ellis</u> took the floor to outline the <u>KOORIE YOUTH PROGRAMME</u>. In his presentation, **Sarah Bamblett** came in with precision on a number of fields.

With the establishment of Victorian Aboriginal Community Services Association Limited (VACSAL), the aboriginal community in Melbourne and throughout Victoria had a voice in local and state government for Koori people. Many service groups arose out of VACSAL one of which the Bert Willams Aboriginal Youth Services (BWAYS) was a leader. To have Arthur as a speaker was a privilege.

In 1984 BWAYS united with VACSAL and its growth has been extraordinary. So many sub-divisions have developed from BWAYS that even Arthur needed prompting from Sarah. To name just a few areas on the list: Youth Justice (KYIP), Early School leavers (ESL), Aboriginal Youth Hostel Crisis/Homelessness, Short Term Accommodation, Victorian Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation (VACCHO).

In most of the specialising groups, the bottom line was <u>mentoring</u>. Certainly combined with practical services but for the younger Koorie generation, when in need, mentoring can not only avert physical and

mental collapse but it can set the individual on a positive and healthy personal growth.

The talks were crowded with acronyms and, as mentioned earlier, so practical many essential services at work and in the of process development.
