<u>OPEN THE DOORS FOUNDATION:</u> Team Leader of Northcote-based OTDF, <u>Helen Christensen</u> has a law degree and 5 children. Her mother is a Tiwi Islander while her dad was one of the stolen generation.

Having worked in student career development with the Catholic Education Office in Melbourne and herself being of Aboriginal descent, Helen sees her transition to OTDF as a reasonable step. OTDF seeks to address the severe educational disadvantage still being experienced by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families. It provides assistance to enable them to choose and successfully maintain a positive educational environment for their children. Current figures demonstrate the need - 32 students were helped in 2001 and this year sees 740 on the books.

The support is for both primary and secondary students with guidance to the tertiary life. The students are in independent schools and the financial assistance, while not covering school

fees, helps with books, uniforms, school camps and other extras.

To fund these students there is a total reliance on grants, bequests, donations and the like.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children still have solid barriers against attaining a place in society and a good enduring education. Helen stressed the importance of bodies as OTDF. Recent years have seen the retention rate improve as also the numbers of graduates from VCE.

The Club has had a few contacts with OTDF in recent years; undoubtedly Helen sees Rotary's Service as a potential collaboration
