SPEAKER LAST WEEK

<u>APHASIA AND SPEECH PATHOLOGY</u>: Speech pathologist J<u>uley Thai</u> is the Coordinator at the Boroondara Community Stroke Hub - Victoria's first Stroke Support Hub. The Hub has permanent facilities were provided by the Boroondara Council. Rotarian David Warry has often declared his interest in the Hub and his admiration for its founder, stroke victim Jenny Cheng.

Juley's aim last Wednesday was to explain the effects of aphasia (an acquired language disorder), how to deal with it and to tolerate it. She compared her listeners' normal daily language



activity with that of a person who has lost the facility. Unimaginable! This language disorder is generally caused by brain damage. It can lead to loss of identity and 99% do not return to work. Hence the grave possibilities of anxiety and depression.

Members could imagine themselves talking over or plainly overlooking a person with this disability. Julie stressed the need to be more aware of one's own presentation; to be more tolerant; to give better eye contact; to speak as one would to any person. Aphasia takes on numerous forms and the listener must be alert. The listener must be aware of hand gestures, facial expressions and even sign language.

Stroke and consequent brain damage is commonly the cause of aphasia. Australia has 500,000 stroke victims and the Darebin area 2,700. If a carer were added to the equation, over one million persons are affected.

Juley achieved her aim stated at the outset (cf. paragraph 2). Members left the meeting better educated and, with Julie, the Stroke Hub has kicked another goal.
