SPEAKER LAST WEEK

Tim Weir is the Business Development Manager for INTERACT AUSTRALIA, a NFP organization operating since 1991, providing of community range services to people with a including disability, Disability Employment Services. Tim has worked throughout Australia assisting in management of large name stores as Coles and Kmart through to small



businesses. These workplaces helped Tim become more actively disability-conscious and to hire people with a disability to become valuable members of their teams/workplaces.

The above introduction really explains I.A. and, together with excellent outline booklets Tim made available at his talk last Wednesday, that is the full story. Tim's enthusiasm and his clear exposition of the fruitfulness of his field of work made for a most refreshing picture loaded with active hope.

Statistics provided by Tim were stunning:

- Over 4 million people in Australia have some form of disability. That's 1 in 5 people.
- 18.6% of females and 18.0% of males in Australia have disability.
- 1.8 million or 50.7 % of Australians aged 65 and over have a disability, compared to 1 in 8 (12.5 %) aged under 65.

 There are 2.1 million Australians of working age with disability. Of these, just over 1 million are employed and another 114,900 are looking for work.

In the field of **employment** of people with a disability:

- Graduates with disability take 56.2% longer to gain fulltime employment than other graduates.
- interact australia
- People with disability aged 15-24 years are 10 times more likely to experience discrimination than those aged 65 years and over.
- The source of discrimination is an employer in almost half of those instances.
- Global research has found that when employee health and wellness is managed well the percentage of engaged employees increases from 7% to 55%.

I.A. joined the IntoWork Group in 2016 and is a member of CoAct. With offices in Preston, Heidelberg, Epping and Hurstbridge, I.A. is a Disability Employment Services Provider. The range of support is immense as is also the wide-challenging field.
