CLUB FORUM

Rita McCall distributed the Draft Agenda for last week's FORUM. This gave members much to share and discuss.

THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT STATEMENT:

Initially Gerry Lyons spoke to the awareness and practical acknowledgement of the traditional ownership of land by such a mixed group of Rotarians in Preston. He remarked on the current conversation members are having regarding the voicing of this acknowledgement. He recommended that members take this conversation to other clubs/businesses and organizations in these suburbs. Gerry's words were full of emotion, especially when it came to the unanimous vote by all present to use the circulated document of *"Recognition and Respect – First Nation People"*.

In response, Ruth McCall remarked that the club's base is of oneness and inclusiveness and that everyone should feel truly welcome. She was disappointed to hear from Gerry Lyons that indigenous leaders generally did not feel welcome at Rotary meetings. She remarked that anything that can be done to alter that impression was both necessary and urgent.

OTHER AGENDA MATTERS:

Much discussion followed coming from many directions:

- One member remarked that the scrapping of grace etc. does not change Rotary nor take away from getting the jobs done.
- Another observed that the club board had agreed to send out a questionnaire to every member before any decision be made. The eventual decision will be made by the board based on member's response to the questionnaire.

- A few members were asking when anything would be decided/changed. The time
 -frame should be brief and much time and discussion has already been expended.
 The survey is out. Members are strongly encouraged to reply as soon as possible.
 The board then decides.
- Another aspect spoken of was that changing tradition was a danger especially for someone from a 'different' background. One responded that the tradition of Rotary is one of service, something also fundamental to most other not-for-profit organisations.

President Chris closed the meeting with the observation that the club is now looking towards its next 60 years of life. Over those past 60 years recently celebrated so much has changed; society is so much more diverse and service is becoming so much more aware and efficient. He remarked that Rotary has to attract these newer generations.

The questionnaire will be circulated ASAP and all are invited to respond ASAP so that the board can then make an informed decision.
