

ROTARY CHEERS VOLUNTEERS

Introducing <u>Speaker Brett Allchin</u>, Chair Carla Finocchiaro stressed Rotary's banner-call to service. In outlining the meaning of the word volunteer she used the word 'freelance' for individuals who, without the support of an organized body and employing their own initiative and time, manage to



Rotarian Brett Allchin has been 27 years serving with the Salvation Army. This has given him wide experience as well as academic qualifications. He sees volunteerism as the centerpiece of Rotary. "It keeps the world spinning". While the present day norm is driven by immediate enjoyment and saving for an enjoyable future, one can puzzle over why people give up time, money and energy to serve.

Why volunteer? Is it giving without return? No. Public opinion backs the experts' finding that it is a boost to one's confidence and self-esteem. It gives one a sense of pride and identity. Volunteers are happier, healthier and sleep better. (At this moment Brett's mobile sounded!)

Statistics included: m6.1 over 24 years of age are involved in formal volunteering (clubs, organizations etc.); 20% of these volunteers involve persons with disabilities, illness etc; 49% are services given to persons outside their own household. Some would explain that it was the right thing to do, while most would be see themselves as responding to a cause and rather than an organizational call. Current findings say that volunteers are doing so for less time than in the past and that organizations such as the CFA and SES are experiencing the pinch. People seem to be responding due to word of mouth, self-referral or because a fellow contact is involved.

Brett finished with a powerful example of Mother Teresa and the statement: "Volunteerism is the most important work in the world".

VOLUNTEER AWARDS:

"To JENNY CHENG in recognition of the volunteering of her services over the years"

In introducing Jenny, David Warry spoke of her having suffered a stroke 22 years ago. In seeking rehabilitation she approached the local Council - Boroondara. With nothing on offer, Jenny set up the Boroondara Stroke Survivors Group. Today it flourishes as one the state's most active and successful. Membership is strong with medical research personnel often using their members. Recently the council gave the Survivors Group a building in High Street, Kew.

Then her group ran a photographic exhibition at the Darebin Centre. Jenny discovered a great need for a Chinese support group in the area. A Darebin club is now flourishing. Jenny has joined the Rotary Club of Kew. As David remarked "It is all about regaining confidence to live a normal life".

After schooling in Bayreuth, Damascus and Bethlehem, Lou Malavisi arrived in Australia in 1954. He ran a mechanics business in Plenty Road for 35 years. Shorty after his arrival he saw the needs of the Melbourne Italian community. Over the past 60



years he has been managing and conducting the renowned choir based at the Capuchin Italian centre in Hawthorn. To him the needs of the local Italian community were obvious and in no time he had the Italian Pensioner Club going in Preston. It flourished and today has 500 members.

Lou recently established a Preston choir, Il Coro Arcobaleno. For a while he was a tourist guide at Pentridge and still is a volunteer-driver of the Darebin Community Health bus.
