These 4 condensed summaries evolved into 4 moments of learning and inspiration. The four students, in part sponsored by the Club, reported on their learning experiences over this recent vacation.

ISSA CHANZI is studying at Northcote High School and this year enters Year 11. As an intro, Issa explained the meaning of Informatics, academic his intense He. interest recently returned from the Australian Informatics Olympiad School of Excellence in Canberra. This was an intense 10-day school the training at



Australian National University. Based on the AIO results, 25 from around Australia were invited to attend. In a short time

their minds expanded with new material in algorithm design and much programming in the computer labs.

It is possible that a few of the audience, editor included, found themselves somewhere lost on a distant galactic planet.



<u>PRAINI PATTON</u> – travelled on a Peace Keeping Mission to Israel (1 week) and Jordan (1 week). In summary the party of 16 youth under 22 years of age travelled extensively and, in 2-3 hour

consultations
with 15 NGOs
and
government

agencies, discussed what is being done in the search for lasting peace in the Middle East. They also met with an Australian Ambassador where much discussion was had on the illegal Israeli settlements. Visits were had to Bedouin camp site, religious and tribal



locations and Syrian refugee sites in Jordan. Where possible they gathered information through face to face interactions. Praini's experiences were extremely educational, definitely leading-edge and at times supremely moving.

LOUISA LOU AND SHELDON MC CUNNIE: National Youth Science Forum is for students who are heading into year twelve and thinking about a career in science, engineering and related disciplines. The students are selected by Rotary and head to Canberra where they are exposed to major scientific institutions and top academic researchers, so that they may make more informed choices for their future endeavors. They are also given training in time management, interview skills and public speaking. In previous years it has been known as the National Science Summer School.

Louisa and Sheldon gave a fulsome report on the 'adventure' - debates on nuclear power, live visits to laboratories, hands-on

scientific experiments using latest research equipment and communication. In space Sheldon's litary of VIPs was Dr Brian Schmidt the Nobel Prize discovered who the winner accelerating expansion of the Universe through observations of distant supernovae! Schmidt also says "we know only 5% of what is out there"



Maybe Sheldon summed up the four speakers well when he said "It has pushed me out of my comfort zone and I want to see how far I can go. It was all an amazing experience and I now see I must work at developing transferable skills. Our thanks go to Elaine Price and Rotary".
