SPEAKER LAST WEEK

<u>PINCHAPOO</u> A noisy meeting became mute. The audience was envisaging a state-wide horizontal and vertical service module in the making. If the Williamstown Lions with its District stretching to the South Australian border, unites in the project with Preston Rotary with its District stretching north to the border, the outcomes would be limitless.

The brand-name of PINCHAPOO certainly is descriptive. A few members still had the wrong interpretation at the end of the meeting! Three speakers took the floor.

The first was Pinchapoo founder, <u>Kate Austin</u>. On a speedy teenage departure from home the big question was "What do I take?" Her answer - "my toothbrush". The rest is history. After some rough years Kate settled down and was asking herself what she could do for those in disaster-like situations. Their immediate need would be those small things that help one connect with the world and restore dignity - toothbrush, soap, towel, shampoo and the like. Hence the logo of Pinchapoo. Collect all those give aways when staying at hotels and motels. Companies have come on board.



Today almost 1 million items that have been distributed to 55 major organizations nation-wide.

Speaker number 2 was <u>Anne Morton</u> from the Williamstown Lions Club. Her Club is in a district spreading west to the S.A. border and north to the Western Highway. At the Lions District Conference in Terang earlier this year Anne heard of the gratitude expressed to Lions especially the Club at Lorne for the assistance given to those in refuge from the recent fires. Anne also heard from one of those who lost her home that her immediate need was to wash and clean up. While driving home, Anne, a person of action, discussed with Lenore Thornton the obvious need and the

ability to provide a bag of 'immediates'.

Neighborhood House. There they have recently introduced the use of showers etc. for the locals. Towels are the immediate need. In no time the response was in the three camps - Pinchapoo, Lions and Rotary.

Lenore sees an even wider application. Why not send a larger pack to all Clubs in Rotary District 9790 informing them of the availability of the pack. Be the need some disaster, family crisis or individual urgency, it all makes sense. Lenore concluded the proposal - combine Lions and Rotary with Pinchaboo. Eventually have on hand the ability to give those in need the immediate chance to have a shower, a wash, rid the smell of fire, restart life

Rotarians were invited to help in Kate's major need - **storage!** Kate has outlined the obvious challenge in this department.
