FINANCIAL PLANNING AND HEALTH NEEDS OF INDIVIDUALS: A large title and necessarily so as it covers a very wide field of financial intricacies and persons' mental and physical health needs. Club member **PAUL CONTE** is a specialty advisor with H&FI and his talk demonstrated the essential value of his work. The aims are to assist people in finding solutions best suited to their unique situations and to alleviate the anxiety of dealing with the financial, social welfare and social service systems.

Paul's sees his work vocation as "We help clients live well by configuring their resources in an enduring way that harnesses their abilities to preserve their rights and wealth. Our objective is to make life less confusing, promote



autonomy and provide the right to a dignified life".

He took all through the challenges that persons with disabilities face, especially the under 35s. His clients present with needing guidance with income, housing and support while in independent living. His task is to select the

appropriate structure. He has to balance taxation, insurance payout,

social/public housing, Centrelink connections – lodging the disability claim and directing the 'how to use'.

H&FI centres around claim rights between health and finance especially as the client progresses through the age range (parents, grandparents....). Referrals are by word of mouth and a few specialty law firms. As Paul described the demands deriving from various disabilities his audience grew in the understanding of the value of his professional skills and services

50 family applications were received and all were given a 2 night family stay at



the Quest Apartment in Albury. Add on meal vouchers for La Maison Restaurant, gift cards, Bunnings and fuel vouchers . . .

In all, a brilliant lift for those fire effected families. Over \$34,000 was raised in the District while the District Bushfire Recovery Committee also did its part.

ROTARY OVERSEAS RECYCLING PROGRAMME: In connection with this recently publicised programme, Rotarian Peter Peyton and the International Committee are currently inspecting, sizing up and assessing three Melbourne playgrounds. Peter reports and asks:

"The International committee has investigated the opportunity to become involved in the recycling of playgrounds. At this point one site has been inspected and photographed ready for the preparation of a plan. A second site has taken the process further with the playground item being coloured coded and marked to identify how the playground can be reassembled at a later date.

The process from this last visit is to have the playground dismantled and transported to a point of safe keeping. When our club reaches this point in the

process a safe storage place will be required and <u>we</u> are asking if anyone would have such a place to use.

It is planned that 5 playgrounds could be stored in a container ready to be shipped overseas. I therefore ask if anyone might be aware of such storage space that could be used for this purpose".
