


SPEAKER LAST WEEK

ROTARYGOLFINGFELLOWSHIP:Introducing speakerLesWoodland, chair IanMusgrovelisted some of the numerous RotaryFellowships available, two of which Ian has joined



- Rotary Cricketing Fellowship and Rotary Recreational Vehicle Fellowship.

Les opened his talk with a short history of the beginnings of his family in WA. Les' grandfather arrived in 1923. As an ex-British soldier he purchased a wheat farm in WA. Their second son was named Les. Les died of polio in the epidemic of 1948. Grandson Les Woodland, speaker/Rotarian/golfer, gave his family story as background. Les joined Rotary not knowing of Rotary's role in wiping out polio. This factor has welded him to Rotary.



Les was a first class cricketer

from 58-97 both in Australia and England. This was followed by the game of golf. In no time he had joined the Golfing Fellowship and 2006 saw him returning to Perth to play in the Fellowship. This was followed by Victor Harbour, Darwin, Adelaide and Hamilton (VIC). The Aussie Fellowship gives entry into the World Fellowship with trips to overseas events. Next year it is Turkey but current international stress will see Les remaining home. Rotterdam and Victoria (Canada) will be down the track.

At these events the contestants are from everywhere, particularly the traditional golfing countries.

Les says "It is fraternity, it is fellowship" - people greeting as if long time best mates. The trick of golf is that all competitions are handicapped which brings about a sense of equality. He was brief but also he was an invitation to members maybe to seek out what could be their fellowship? **VOCATIONAL SHORT PRESENTATION BY CLUB MEMBER:** Due to illness Chris Shields was unable to make his presentation and John McCarthy was the stand-in. John spoke to the 3 allotted points.

<u>1. Profession - selection</u>. It was either to join the navy (living in the environs of the Port Melbourne marine activity) or to become an RC priest (living in a family with many family members as priests/religious sisters). John chose the latter. <u>An informed decision</u>? John questioned the age at which one is mature!

<u>2. Mentorship</u>? Early days both in Church service and in Rotary there seemed to be little or no mentoring. Thankfully that has changed, eg. Sam Manhom presentation and the Rotary Club of Manningham.

<u>3.</u> Professional Skills Transferable To Rotary? Interchange abounds. John has been Bulletin editor since '96 and sees publicizing Rotary works as GOOD NEWS in general for people worried about today's world.
