

ROTARY OCEANIA MEDICAL AID FOR CHILDREN

ROMAC

The title is **BOLD** because it is a teaching tool! Yes. One estimate is that 60% of Rotarians, while totally aware of the subject, do not know the meaning of ROMAC.

With great enthusiasm, **Katherine Baverstock** outlined the present status of ROMAC. Her methodology was, with



vision, to show 'cases' of children from the Oceania region grossly affected by body lesions, deformities and life-threatening pediatric disabilities. Her photos were both pre and post medical intervention.

A lecturer at RMIT University at Bundoora, Katherine is a member of the District ROMAC Committee and tirelessly speaks to the cause at Club meetings and in the wider circle.

Rotary N.Z. and Rotary Australia have combined in the ROMAC programme which caters for children exclusively from Oceania. All moneys donated are used solely in Australia and never overseas. Doctors involved generally operate out of humanitarian motivation while many hospitals reduce or minimize their fees. Many children have heart problems and coronary care in Oceanic countries is low. The Children's Hospital is on board and demand is high.

Hosts for the children and parents are always in demand. Offers of drivers, visitors, entertainers and interpreters are actively being sought. Finance from individuals and corporates is tax deductible.

The Exum achievement continues! Cecil's daughter, Tiera, previously a




gymnast champion, has now broken into the level of Australian sprint champions. It was Tiera who ran into second place in the Stawell Gift last week. Here she is

Finance has been varied: \$1,000 each to Rachel Taplin to attend a therapeutic arts programme for HIV positive children in Kenya, and to Victoria El Hage to attend a Model UN Assembly in Rome. A total of \$10,000 has been put together (International \$3,000, Club \$5,000 and \$2,000 from District) for a Burnett Institute programme working on malaria elimination on the Cambodia/Vietnam border. \$1,000 together with \$4,000 Club funds for Fiji cyclone relief. \$1,000 each to Medicins sans Frontiers, Care Australia and ShelterBox Aust.

A request has been received from a student on Bathurst Island to complete her education in Aust. Her aim is to study P.E. so as to develop sporting programmes for the youth of her community.

EXODUS ROSTER: It resumes April 21. The roster will be published next week.






