SPEAKER LAST WEEK

THE FUTURE OF THE MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY:

PP Paul Smarrelli has climbed the ladder from starting his apprenticeship at Preslite to becoming its general manager for 24 years; from managership to manufacturing tutelage for the Commonwealth: from various overseas marketing meets to a recent appointment with the Darebin Council running an export facilitating programme with 15 local companies.

Paul opened his talk with a quote from the CSIRO "The Australian



manufacturing industry is not dying, it's evolving".

An audience test (hands on heads) showed the following results:

- Australia's Manufacturing Index is 8% higher in 2017 than 2002
- 2. Sales & Service income from mining in Australia is lower than manufacturing (.7%)
- Retail Trade total annual profit margin is lower than manufacturing

<u>What it means to be a manufacturer</u>: The innovation resulting from technology, such as automation and new materials, has changed the equation. Manufacturing is no longer a basic industry that employs low-skilled workers. Over the next 20 years Australia's manufacturing industry <u>must transform</u> into a highly-integrated, collaborative and export-focused operation. The Australian companies that have



already embraced this evolution are performing with much higher profit margins.

Paul explained how Australia's manufacturing sector has surged to its highest level in 15 years. However the employment level in Australia has decreased. Manufacturing employment in

1988 was 1,170,000. Currently manufacturing employment stands at 838.000.

From Paul's perspective manufacturing today is all about business improvement, the essential value of a professional business sheet and it's relationship to development eg. the supply chain or cost of materials. Finally the field that currently shows the best potential is <u>the food industry</u>.

AGEING POSITIVE DIGITAL STORYTELLING INTERGENERATIONAL PROJECT: Yes, that's the title! Club Youth Service Director Joe Morris and his committee are studying the programme with the help of David Warry an active participant in PADSIP.

PADSIP brings together older adults and youth with the aim of producing digital stories about aspects of the older person's life; not solely a comparison between their lives but also ideas that emerge from the comparison. They meet for an hour in small groups. Both older and younger tell their life stories and often discover they have much in common. Digital practice emerges from the experience.

LITERACY is at the heart of basic education for all, and essential for eradicating poverty, reducing child mortality, curbing population growth, achieving gender equality and ensuring sustainable development, peace



and democracy.

Literacy is a significant and specific goal for Rotary. It is so important that it is one of the 6 areas of focus for Rotary Foundations The Future Vision BASIC -EDUCATION AND LITERACY. Such importance has been placed on literacy that Rotary International has created ۵ "Rotary

Literacy Month" which takes place during September.

THE INNER NORTH COMMUNITY FOUNDATION: Rosemary Wilcox and Joe Morris recently attended the INCF presentation of Grants. The grants were from their 2017 <u>Pathways to Employment</u> <u>Grant Program.</u> Members will remember there were meetings scheduled as part of the decision process. Rosemary and Joe represented the Club in these discussions.

This year the Foundation gave out grants totaling $\frac{375,740}{12,000}$. In the Foundation the Rotary Club of Preston has a Sub Fund of \$12,000 which, in the last financial year, has achieved about 5% interest, \$600. This will become a part of their youth decision program (i.e. young people at Northcote High making decisions regarding \$15,000 to be distributed to local charities).

INTERPLAST: Rotarians were there in the beginning. They've been a constant throughout the decades and they're very much a part of Interplast's bright future. Rotary was involved in the establishment of Interplast in 1983 with the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons.

Icons Daryl Braithwaite, Russell Morris and Chris Wilson are joining forces for a special concert hosted by Richard Stubbs to support Interplast's work changing futures across the Asia Pacific.


