

SPEAKER LAST WEEK

WaSH (Wash, Sanitation, Hygiene) PROGRAMMES: After BILL CHAPMAN'S address to the Club last Wednesday, one Member remarked that it was most unusual, in fact a first, to have heard the

word defecation mentioned so often in a public arena. One could add that defecation did not have it all to itself. Other references as solid matter, urine, squat and pedestal seats also rated well on the score-board.

However that observation does not to take away



the profound gravity of Bill's subject when, amongst other statistics, Bill said that every day, 1,000 children under 5 years of age die from diaphone.

Water and sanitation were the centre of his presentation, as they also are in Rotary International, WHO and UNICEF. Goals have been



set and so far the water goals are being achieved but sanitation has fallen well behind. The current aim is to get toilets into schools, teach the young, and then homes will follow. Hygienic practices as washing hands after toilet use

and before eating are steadily being introduced. Bill said that from the introduction of toilets and teaching the use of soap would reduce the death toll by 70%.

Another principle espoused by Bill was the need for ownership. Bill is working in many Pacific fields and he avers that once the locals see the practical benefit of toilets, especially waterless toilets, the locals will take it on. Currently waterless toilets are the rage. When they see the division of fluid and solid and their consequent use as fertilizers, they are immediate believers and so value the presence of toilets.

Bill's wide knowledge of the various strategies and equipment was obvious. He described questions of education in the field be it of engineers in the first world or of those who are being supplied with new age technologies.
