

SPEAKER LAST WEEK



This was a replay of a webinar entitled "<u>STEPS TO SUCCESS</u>". It was run by Fiona Biedermann, a Rotarian of St. Peters Club in South Australia. Members viewed the webinar and followed it with numerous observations. The webinar was easy to follow and members found it both challenging

and also most analytic of Preston's current functioning. Fiona kept to her presentation plan.

Her address was based on the 3 C's for successful leadership and then an examination of a critical alignment model. Firstly, the 3 C's:

- 1. Communication. It is essential that all actions and decisions within the club be clearly explained as to what and why. A new member enters a meeting. Are they greeted as someone special? Are they well settled? With the passage of time are they included in club decisions, club needs and club actions? Are matters being dealt with clearly exposed to all members in a clear and educational manner? Is there a structure for choosing new ideas/projects?
- 2. **Collaboration** bringing people together within the club, other clubs, service groups and with other communities and businesses.
- Commitment "walking our own talk". The club must live its' own beliefs and behaviours; actually doing what is being talked about. At times it may mean getting out of a comfort zone and doing things a bit differently.

Then using the critical alignment model Fiona gave 4 headings:

- 1. **Environment** a visitor or a new member walks into the club how do they feel, what do they hear, what do they see? She then gave an example of a poorly treated potential buyer who entered a car dealership.
- 2. **Structure** enables people to take action, it enables understanding and involvement in discussions and decisions. It continually examines processes of education for new members. It studies the management of

new ideas and projects. It offers clear plans for members taking on new roles and tasks.

- Implement the need for true discussion, group decision-making in order that all members are a part of what is being done. It means sharing, involving, engaging and spreading the workload and sharing outside the club.
- People at times 'outsiders' can equivocate to "It's our joy and no-one needs to know"! <u>The key to a club's demise!</u> Publicity in not bragging. It's sharing a needful good successful story, the key to growth. People are the heart and soul of Rotary. Passion, motivation and mentorship.

Following Fiona's presentation there followed many positive observations – new ideas get all more excited, industry has been bypassed, showcasing is up to each member and then *"would you like to be involved?"*


