

SPEAKER LAST WEEK

RESERVOIR NEIGHBOURHOOD HOUSE is almost a regular feature in in the club bulletin. <u>Angie Davidson</u> has been its Executive Officer over the

past 10 years. From her early days she has practised family care and community work. She has a uni degree in the field and, due to the recent mental effects of Covid, Angie is now writing a paper on counselling. To hear Angie's talk on the operation and development of RNH was both educational and inspiring.

Beginning with a small community house to connect with the numerous Housing Commission Estates situated in East Reservoir, development into specialised service offerings had to happen. RNH is now heavily involved with people of the area, all with



identifiable needs in many fields. Angie gave out many figures demonstrating the material out reach. One example was that in one week of 4 days over 330 hand-outs were possible for a family of up to 4 persons. Such steps de-stresses people and enables them to talk out what other troubles they may be facing. So many residents suffer from Covid outcomes – financial, mental and social.

Often in her talk Angie thanked club members and friends who help RNH stockup, sort, etc. Food Bank in Yarraville is so well stocked but transport to Reservoir is not possible, hence Preston Rotary transporter-volunteers. So many other fields of regular assistance are being developed – elderly needing podiatry care, people without medical support, even haircuts. It is not strange to meet someone who has not had a haircut in 2 years Towards the end of her talk Angie described a mural project called Colour My Neighbourhood (CMN). Local estates were built in the 50s and while the external grounds are seeming well kept the inner areas often are either badly graphitized or totally unkempt. Through the voice of RNH residents now have been given a voice to update community areas as laundries, some in bad shape since construction. CMN has sought from residents the visual needs, the preferred subjects to be depicted, the colours etc. and now the expert work has started with remarkable success.
