

SPEAKER LAST WEEK

SPAN COMMUNITY HOUSE: (64 Clyde st Thornbury).



SPAN is ultraan dynamic hub of community adult and learning in the heart of Thornbury, providing access innovative through resources learning programmes and community development activities.

Speaker <u>Colleen Duggan</u>, manager of Span, tabled a booklet with an extensive list of learning and activities programmes stretching from *Improved Employment or Study Paths* to *Singing for Pleasure*.

The Brotherhood of St Laurence opened Span in 1978 particularly for Senior Citizens. Modern approaches saw the house converted into a Neighbourhood House. As for most Neighbourhood Houses (400 in Victoria), Span is governed by an independent board and is run by paid staff and volunteers. Funding comes from State and Council Grants and private donations. Span has a turnover of circa \$260,000.

Colleen dispelled the idea that Neighbourhood Houses were solely for the disadvantaged. On the contrary. While the larger part is centred on the disadvantaged, Span caters for all. Once the need is established the House sets about providing. This is done at lower fees than in the larger learning centres and with equal or higher quality.

As illustrated above, Colleen highlighted the <u>Sensitive Santa</u> of last Christmas. This was for children with autism and other such challenges. Often Santas are found in noisy, busy and rushed shopping centres. Darebin Council financed a Sensitive Santa where the children could spent quiet time with Santa without cameras and the like. An outstanding success it was.



Colleen's presentation was a clear and most helpful insight for all present.
