In the Little Doomsday Book (1086), PEYTON appears as a small village in Essex. In Preston Rotary circles however, Peyton carries a great personal story. Last Wednesday members heard a summary of that story from the man himself, PETER PEYTON.

Daylesford saw the beginnings of the large Peyton family and, with the death of his father from T.B., it was to finishing school in Alphington. In the early 60's Pater took a job in Preston land surveying, then a move to the Titles Office to be followed by 4 years surveying with a firm in Mount Waverley. After a few stints helping out at this first employer's business in Preston, Peter took it over in 1970 and remained there till retirement.

It was the shire engineer of Whittlesea who introduced Peter into Rotary. The same person invited him onto a team putting together a plan for the development of a large farm on the edge of Bundoora, Mill Park. For the next 33 years Peter was much present in its development. In naming the streets one can spot a Peyton Drive!



Most sports saw Peter participating be it with bat, ball, racquet, on the track or in the pool. Football received the most attention.

Peter's marriage to Pat flourished with 5 children. After a few neighborhood moves, Heidelberg and the Yarra gave a great space for the family's growth. Sadly the dream ran out. Pat succumbed to a battle she had fought with skin cancer. Not only Peter and the family but a wide range of committees and friends lost an energetic and loving lady.

A chance meeting 10 years later saw a new love in Peter's life, Christina. Christina has a son and Christina and Peter now are well into the grandparent role with 12 grandchildren. After a few moves, Peter and Christina now live in East Kew close to transport and facilities. Outside his Rotary work Peter plays tennis, looks after 2 competition teams and is involved in a number of community services. While evoking deep admiration and esteem, Peter's talk invited many questions.


