

SPEAKER LAST WEEK

BURNET INSTITUTE: Jack Richards, Laboratory Head, Malaria and Tropical Diseases, Burnet Institute, took his audience through tuberculosis in the days of Egyptian mummies to present day East

Timor. Jack's topic was close to home given that two of his close relations were victims of **TB**, as also were Chopin, George Orwell and the Bronte sisters.

TB is airborne-spread through the community with great ease and can lay dormant in the body till old age when it is often fatal. A large family group sharing a small hut is a perfect nest for TB. Active TB slowly erodes the lung and 50% of those suffering active TB will die.



Diagnosis is done by clinical examination, chest X-ray, sputum sample, culture test or, in recent times, by Xpert, a cartridge based automated diagnostic test that can identify Mycobacterium tuberculosis within 2 hours. Jack noted that the Club assisted in one Xpert machine's arrival in Dili and also in the training of two personnel for its use.

Out bush in East Timor there is minimal medical support. This is the big need. 4 very old drugs are administered to TB sufferers and currently more modern drugs are being tested. The other challenge is that 50% of the population is resistant to those drugs. Vaccine does not stop the arrival of TB; it simply stops the patient from dying with TB.

9.6 million new cases are reported world-wide with TB each year with 1.4 million deaths. Timor is so close and yet the disease is so prevalent. Transport logistics are at times impossible. Families are large. Malnutrition is rampant. The 1999 referendum for separation from Indonesia and the massacre following saw the

destruction of 80% of infra services and the recovery has still a long way to go. Current numbers in East Timor are, of a population of 1.2 million, there are 4,000 new cases diagnosed each year with over 1,000 deaths. Australia 1,300 annually.



What to do? Firstly to supply the needs of those in the field in East Timor. Most medics either were killed or left the country in 1999. Now new medics are being trained in Cuba and returning to the field. Diagnostic staff are being trained. New tests are being developed.

Jack concluded his most important presentation by quoting Moliere who also died from TB:

The greater the obstacle, the more glory in overcoming it.

VOCATIONAL: Chair Carla Finocchiaro gave the committee report for the year so far.

- 5 minute Vocational Talks have been well accepted.
- The ongoing Pride of Workmanship Award was organized by Les Woodland in co-operation with NMIT Preston.
- Activity is advancing for a Community Award to recognize Volunteers in the Darebin Community. More later.
- The big proposal is the Pavilion School Skill Shed project. So far the planning has been spot-on and if implemented the outcomes for the students will be enormous.

PROGRAMMES: Chair Elaine Price outlined the Committee's projects and many of those completed have been reported back at Club meetings.

- NYSF Candidate Tess Devine-Hercus attended the Forum in Canberra. Moo Gay Kunoo attended RYLA. Another student has been fostered for studies at Melb. University A student from Ruthven College is being offered the opportunity to attend the Rotary Adventure in Citizenship being held in Canberra
- The Pavilion Schools Skill Shed Project is also in planning.
- Talks continue re the Northland Youth Ed. project.
- Children's Protection Society is breaking grounds in their practice.
- Together with Darebin Police, Pavilion School and the Club a combined programme to protect and further the skills education for youth in danger is in the planning stage.

COMMUNITY: Chair Julie Norris reported on her committee's actions so far this year:

- BBQ at Thornbury Primary School Centenary raised \$600 for their Indigenous and Camping Programme.
- A Northland event with the Darebin Council 7 members volunteering.
- Gave \$1,000 to Speech Pathology Dept at Bundoora Extended Care towards an Intelligaze Camera for eye gaze communication as patients' speech and hand skills diminish
- \$1000 was donated to a local Para Badminton Cerebral Palsy player to attend the World championships in the UK in September.
- The Club also maintained its' fortnightly roster at the Bellbardia food preparation in Heidelberg.
- In December, East Reservoir Neighborhood House BBQ with 6 Rotarians and 2 partners volunteering, consuming 48 loaves of bread (i.e. the customers!). Club also contributed \$1,100.
- Partnering with x-Rotarian Ben Bliss of Toynetworx \$1,350 worth of toys for the Exodus community at Christmas.
- The Seniors Christmas Lunch at St George's restaurant. \$2,700 provided lunch for 59 elderly with transport by Club members.
- Ray White Real Estate Reservoir collected Christmas gifts and the Club distributed them to causes in the Preston area.
- A continuing donation of \$500 to Darebin Community Mental Health Christmas Lunch.
- \$500 also to local man towards wheelchair repair.

Currently the Committee is researching Safe Steps, Preston Neighborhood House and the Aboriginal Advancement league. With a budget of \$18,000 there remains \$5,300 in kitty.
