The façade of <u>The Pavilion School</u> (TPS) does not illustrate the specialised modelling and the futuristic structure of the education being shared inside. <u>Andrew Zarafa</u>, the Pathways Coordinator, has served at the school since its early days. Chair Paul Smarrelli described Andrew's work as one of the hardest jobs he has witnessed in his career.

The TPS aims to re-engage young people who are currently cut off from any form



of education by providing students with a relevant and individually tailored curriculum. TPS aims to provide students with a learning environment that is supportive and productive and seeks to create literate, numerate and curious learners. Teachers and support staff primarily seek to create and maintain a positive environment by following a student-centred approach, one that older Rotarians would not have experienced in their school days.

It was a mammoth task for Andrew to summarise recent developments at the school, particularly the building of the Rotary Skills Workshop and Hands On Learning Shed. Then, in recent times, it's totally new supply of work/trade instruments. This brings with it the daily developments of new trade areas and the off campus implementation of these newly learned student skills.

With the help of Rotary funds many new socialising areas as BBQ, outdoor/pergola and veranda, outdoor tables and dining areas all crafted and

designed in the Hands On Learning Shed have been constructed. During and after the Covid lockdown many local community groups and families enjoyed the outdoor recreation area and now continue to do so.

Andrew was most grateful to Preston Rotary and more recently other clubs for



their generous assistance over these years.
