

## **SPEAKER LAST WEEK**

Given these times of terrible news, reports of inhumane action state and global, dark places of Covid pandemics, continual political bickering, employment insecurity, open and hidden racism — it was a strong breeze of hope for the future when speaker Bruce Walker outlined the enlivening operation of **ROMAC — Rotary Oceania Medical Aid For Children.** 

Benalla Rotarian and recently elected District Chair Of ROMAC, Bruce had driven down from northern Victoria and, with the help of a freshly produced overhead, members present were left well informed of ROMAC's works as also the call for both finance and volunteers.


In the form of life-giving and dignity-restoring surgery not accessible to children in their home countries in the Pacific region, ROMAC provides the necessary surgical treatment both in Australia and New Zealand.



ROMAC was started in 1987 by Kangaroo Flat Rotarian Barrie Cooper and his wife Clarabelle, a nurse. During a visit to Fiji they became aware of the need to assist children there who had major medical issues that could not be handled in Fiji at the time. Now over 30 years down the track ROMAC has been able to give new life and dignity to more than 500 children.

The large field of volunteers co-ordinating ROMAC's works are non-paid. All income is used for running expenses. It is notable that ROMAC's National Patron till his death in 2016 was Max Walker. Max gave well over 100 major talks on the subject.

As mentioned earlier in this review, Bruce stressed the fact that ROMAC is fast growing. With the growth comes the need for increased finance and more volunteers with their own abilities – hosts, transporters, coordinators etc. ROMAC is yet another Rotary programme serving up hope to a challenged world.


