

55 YEARS OF ROTARY SERVICE

The Rotary Club of Preston Chartered 21/12/1960. Initial Meeting 1.3.1961

The evening celebration of the 55th was a sparkling night at St Georges Melbourne Polytechnic Restaurant. A warm enthusiastic crowd. P.H.F. recognition for Jack Wilcox. The Rotary induction of Frank Brass. The presence of Rotarian Joy Crampton whose husband Mark was a Charter Member. Entrees of Karaage fried chicken Ribs with Kimchi mayonnaise and salted radish. All topped off with Club Friend Speaker Margaret Smith A.O.

<u>CHILDREN FIRST FOUNDATION</u>: Till her retirement last year from CFF, the names <u>MARGARET SMITH</u> and <u>CFF</u> were inseparable.

Margaret began adult life using her Diploma in Business Management and eventually working in the high corporate world. After some years she moved into the philanthropic sector and in this environment she



met Moira Kelly. At that time Moira was running an ad hoc programme bringing children from Bosnia elsewhere and to Australia for lifechanging medical treatment. Margaret saw that this needed rationalizing and hence the birth of CFF 16 years ago. Development and expansion quickly followed.

Beginning her talk one day after International Women's Day, Margaret voiced an enthusiastic welcome to Liangyu Wei as also a sincere recognition of Joy Crampton whom she described as "sensational".



followed short video of the children at various of stages their medical journey. The video was by Jaimie backed Lee's moving song "Different on the outside", catch it again on YouTube.

Margaret's highlight was in meeting the then D.G. Geoff McIlvenna! There was an urgent need

to formulize/stabilize the many and various activities all happening at once. Also there was need to gather as many backing entities as possible. Margaret's CFF was the answer. She was able to get businesses to back the programme. A base was needed for children awaiting attention and then for rehabilitation. A few towns rejected the idea as not being a 'good look' and it was D.G. Geoff who enlisted an enthusiastic Rotary Club of Kilmore with the land and a farmer from near Bright with a house. Preston's building-Rotarian Bernie Lamers and Gerry hopped in, David De La Coeur, Peter Gilbert and Peter Peyton and an army of OTHERS.

All this time Margaret was gathering generous corporates and smaller businesses which gave the C.F.F. credibility.

A spectacular festival backed the opening of the farm by Governor John Landy. Numerous large hospitals came on board. A house was bought in North Melbourne. Recently a bush fire threatened the farm but a rally by CFA and others saved most of everything after a fight

of 36 hours. Every year there has been renovations, additions, asphalting, drainage, painting both at Kilmore and North Melbourne.

Margaret listed the umpteen hidden factors needing resolution before a child arrives at Tullamarine - distant tribal locations, medical assessments, migration dept. and embassy clearances, transport, prior medical agreements etc. Then she related the well-known work with the twins Krishna and Trishna, a most exhausting 24/7 piece of history including 9 major surgeries. Meanwhile Emmanuel is doing some singing overseas, while Ahmed is trying for the 100 metres breaststroke at the Rio Paralympic Games.

While the CFF is flourishing, the supply of philanthropic partners is drying up; hence Margaret's gratitude for the Club's continuing support. Notable is the presence of Club member Peter Gilbert still acting as honorary secretary and treasurer. In this article many benefactors are not named but their input must remain their eternal joy. Unreservedly, those present last Wednesday knew they were privileged to have spent so much time listening to Margaret Smith AO.
