

SPEAKER LAST WEEK

WHEELCHAIRS FOR KIDS (WFK):

On returning home to Australia, a group of Queensland Rotarians responded to the glaring need in neighbouring underresourced countries for the mobilization of children with illnesses such as cerebral palsy. In no time they were adapting BMX parts and making 10 wheelchairs a month.



Meanwhile a Perth Christian Brother, Olly Pickett, with the help of the Rotary Club of Scarborough, W.A., developed the idea. They now have a factory employing 150 volunteers plus a volunteer waiting list of 50! They assemble 300 chairs a month @ \$150 a chair. All materials are imported from China.

Speaker <u>Russell Hayes</u>, of the Rotary Club of Wandon, said the chairs are durable and can be adapted to local terrain. Their assembly in loco is generally done by the local occupational therapist. The distribution is under directions from the local medical centre and the local Rotary club. The recipients are 'village' children, all of whom have advanced untreated



disabilities. Often young children are carried to school by other children but this ceases as the body grows to around 6, 7 or 8 years. This sees the child staying at home in a 'back room' condition for the rest of life.

So far 28,000 wheelchairs have been placed in 80 countries. Russell's presentation was most convincing. Barbara Gilbert spoke of the success of her DG's Partner's Programme. That year, Barbara's charity met the cost of 366 chairs. Members present

last Wednesday were moved by the value, urgency and practicality of Russell's programme. At the meeting's conclusion, led by Rotarian Kapil Argarwal, many members were ready to buy a chair or 2.

CURRENT PROGRESS OF THE LOVINA PROJECT: Founder of the Project, Jo Staunton, was presented with a cheque by PP Peter Byrne. Readers will remember a previous presentation by Jo on her 2009 trip to Bali where she met and 'adopted' a family living a most frugal existence, roadside, near her resort. Through her acutely active observations Jo is doing something about not only the family but the young women of Bali and, in particular, a Lovina orphanage.

Jo explained the progress on her 2 step project.

- 1. The acquisition of land and the building of a homestay block. This is progressing with some rooms and roofing already completed.
- 2. The construction of a holiday resort to accommodate overseas guests, the profit going to the betterment of local disadvantaged Balinese women.
