

MATT GOODWIN is a Sustainable Energy Consultant with <u>One Sustainability Services</u>. Matt also has an interest in <u>Solar On The Go</u>, mobile solar power systems. Matt's address to the Club was very technical with a colouring of statistics, mathmatics and computations. Given this introduction, at the head of this article are the contacts for Matt. He has graciously offered to advise on systems, mechanics,

products by e-mail or phone. Mattalso warned that his basic reasoning in the field is dominated by what is long-lasting and what is serviced by the best workers in the trade.

Matt started his talk by comparing the two panel types - monocrystalline and polycrystalline (power per square



metre of panel). In the end they are much the same. His advice - get professional advice. Then he spoke of the direction and number of panels. Interestingly shade one panel (mono) and the rest follow suit = nil power. A cold spring day is the best as above 60 celsius the output decreases. There are some panels that are the exception.

When installing get as much work done as possible. Return visits by tradies are expensive. He advised not to buy batteries yet as they are

still in the developmental stage; though one should install the wiring.

Matt concluded with "If you don't understand your bill or quote I am open to offering advice". In the end, the cost and performance of your system will depend not only on the panels you use, but also on your solar inverter, your installer's labour costs, and the orientation of your home's roof and tilt angle of your panels.
