

CLUB HISTORY



WEDNESDAY 3 NOV. 1960 is a day of which Preston Rotarians should be immensely proud. This fact is not because the previous day saw the unbacked N.Z. outsider High Jinx take out the Melbourne Cup at 10,000 to one, nor because in that race Dow Street lost its apprentice rider McCarthy, nor because it was the day after the first centenary of the running of the Cup.

Rather the pride in that day is due to the fact that <u>Alf Bean</u> convened the first board meeting of the Preston Rotary Club on that day, Wednesday, Nov. 3, 1960. This occurred 60 years ago. Alf chaired the meeting in his business office on High Street, Preston, where he ran a shoe shop. Prior to founding the Preston club Alf was a member of the Rotary Club of Northcote.

During his long service as a Rotarian Alf recruited many members from that business section of High Street. As the slogan says **EACH ONE, BRING ONE**.

Yes, club members have reason to rejoice in such a rich history that followed.

SPEAKER LAST WEEK

ROTARY FOUNDATION was the challenge for speaker <u>Max Walsh.</u> A 'challenge' because R.F. can be difficult to follow both for old and new members. A number of aspects were underlined during Max's talk.

R.F. has its funds chiefly from voluntary contributions. Hence the ongoing need for members to seek out opportunities/occasions to make their own donations and where possible on a regular basis. The R.F.Trust a/c website is to be found on the last page of the Weekly Bulletin.

Applying for a grant from the Foundation is a competitive affair with only a certain amount made available to a Rotary district and each club annually. The grant is made available on the amount contributed by the district/club and to the specific community need involved, not to another organisation.

The process demands applications before the end of the Rotary year and consideration is given during the following year. Max was asked if Preston Rotary Club was using the fund with any strength and, seemingly, the answer is no. Maybe club committees need to keep this possibility on the table. The last application was made by the Environment and Conservation Committee in July 2020 for its planting programme.



Max concluded with an offer to help any member who wishes to set up a site fundraising for R.F. when celebrating/commemorating any special occasion. This could be an alternative to flowers, presents, wedding gifts and the like. Maybe a member could think-up just a fundraiser event.
