<u>PASS THE WORD AROUND</u>: We are close to eradicating a human disease for only the second time in history. A global public-private partnership has reduced the poliovirus case load by 99.9% over the last 30 years, but there's still plenty of work





Even before we reach that milestone, the knowledge and the infrastructure built to fight polio is being repurposed to take on other global challenges.

Fewer that 40 children were paralyzed by polio in 2016, the lowest number in history. Estimated cases in 1985 were

350,000 in 125 countries. In 1988 Rotary was joined in the effort by W.H.O., the US Center for Disease Control, UNICEF and, more recently, by the Gates Foundation.
