

SPEAKER LAST WEEK

Through his current position as Senior Sergeant at the Reservoir police station or through his lengthy family connections both with past police and with army service personnel, **Peter Sambell** is very involved with the local communities. He is widely recognised for his work with people from diverse cultural and ethnic communities, which is so essential in northern suburban life.

In opening his talk, Peter said he was trying to find a common link between Rotary service, military service and policing. This caused him to reflect not only on "Uncle Billy", his great, great uncle **William "Rusty" Ruthven V.C.,** but also on his own career. He Immediately came up with three principles SERVICE, VALUES AND LEADERSHIP.



Born in Collingwood in 1893 Rusty enlisted at the age of 22. Within months, he was in Gallipoli, then France where he was wounded. In no time he became a sergeant.



Bloodshed on those French fields was horrific. Almost singlehanded he captured, destroyed, halted the enemy while being continually under fire. Again he was wounded. This brought him the award of the Victoria Cross.

Returning to Australia as a hero Rusty married and moved to Werrimul, a soldier settlement area west of Mildura. Bad health brought him back to Melbourne where he became mayor of Collingwood in 1945. He was elected into the State Legislative Assembly as Labor member for Preston, later for Reservoir. Retirement came in 1961. After serving in countless

community service positions especially with the R.S.L. including Preston and timekeeper for the Collingwood Football Club, William Rusty Ruthven died in 1970.

Peter saw all this SERVICE as based on William's VALUE he placed on life. Service and Values automatically lead to LEADERSHIP. All three Peter saw as being in his own DNA and, as mentioned earlier, the reflective dots which join together in Rotary. He underlined that while he described these factors in Uncle Billy's life, he still reflects and questions their presence in his own life, be it with the police force and the lives of those he meets.
