SPEAKERS LAST WEEK



Video speaker was <u>Forest Resener</u>, Operations Director for STI. The video was made for Rotary clubs world-wide with the intention of expanding what was initiated by a Rotary club in Oregon, USA.

In the third world, smoke from indoor cooking fires is a leading cause of death of children under age five, and the world's largest environmental killer. Open indoor cooking is the usual for 4 billion homes. These fires kill eight times as many people as malaria.



Millions of women and children suffer painful burns and a young child breathes in the equivalent of 4 packs of cigarette-smoke per day.

USA-based <u>Forest Resener</u> is the Operations Director for StoveTeam International in Oregon, USA. Forest is excited to raise awareness for the issue of open-fire cooking while continuing to create innovative solutions that maximize the efficiency, reach, and scalability of StoveTeam's programmes, particularly in Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua and El Salvador.

StoveTeam's cookstoves are designed to be handmade by local people using local materials, and they are perfect for cooking the foods that people in Latin America rely on. These stoves eliminate toxic smoke inside the home. They also save children from the danger of burns, prevent CO2 from entering the atmosphere, save families time and money on gathering wood, all while



enriching local economies!

78,000 cookstoves have been locally manufactured and distributed over the past 10 years.

Many enthusiastic ideas followed the presentation with great material for the International Committee.


