Two speakers from Youth Support and Advocacy Service (YSAS) carved

out a widespread summary of the multiple operations of YSAS. **Lydia Schurer** has been with YSAS for the past 10 years and ex secondary school teacher while **Bede Selleck** has been with YSAS for the past 2 years. YSAS is Australia's largest youth specific organization. Operating since 1998, YSAS now employs over 400 skilled staff across 19 sites in metropolitan and regional Victoria.



Originally in Preston, the centre has now moved to The Hub, a one-time Centrelink building on High St, Epping. Lydia has served in many of the specialty




areas while Bede is currently in the field of psychosocial assistance for newly arrived refugee youth.

The best outline of YSAS is a list of its customer related personnel and some of its service departments. lt is entirely involved with the younger generation who have fallen victims of mental illness, homelessness, desocialisation, drug and alcohol misuse. Hence the title Youth Support and Advocacy Service.

Both Lydia and Bede echoed the professional acceptance and aid offered these young people. A sign of this aid is the departmental specializations YSAS has developed. Spread widely throughout the state, YSAS offers residential care, aboriginal support, leadership development, continuing aid for young people in employment and community integration. The list is endless and stands as an ongoing sign of what can be achieved for today's tested youth.

Regionalisation Project



Members are invited to scroll the internet (as below) to be better informed re the Regionalisation Project

With a century of service under our belt and support of the Rotary International Board, we're ensuring Rotary continues to do good and flourish in our region with a more contemporary structure. It aims to better support clubs and members to connect with more volunteers develop leadership skills and collaborate with one another and our communities to change the world.

A pilot program is proposed for Rotary Zone 8, which includes Australia, New Zealand, American Samoa, Cook Islands, Fiji, French Polynesia, Kiribati, New Caledonia, Norfolk Island, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Timor Leste, Tonga and Vanuatu.

On the 13th April 2022 the Council on Legislation voted strongly in favour of a pilot being undertaken in Zone 8 on the basis our clubs and districts support this happening by 1st October 2022. The plan is to explore, test and develop a framework developed by the Board's Shaping Rotary's Future Committee to confirm what works and what doesn't in our Zone. If the pilot proceeds, it will occur whilst districts remain in place and in full consultation with districts and clubs.
