SPEAKER LAST WEEK

To date, the C.V. of Canterbury Rotarian Janet Hay exhaustive in the reading. Starting out stage а and as production manager has she moved through special event management, years as property developer, caring for asylum seekers Christmas Island. working the with Salvation Army on and Nauru Manus Island, then home for a Master's in Int. Cooperation and



Humanitarian Aid. Her dissertation was entitled: "To Give or to Lend? Social Business and the Charity Model: Calling in the Generosity in Economics." Janet also accommodated Club student Lia Wei for 12 months. Lia was present at her address to the Club.

In explaining today's talk Janet used a number of models. Her first was the iconic humanitarian <u>Nicholas Winton</u>, a hero who saved hundreds of children from extermination during the Hitler regime. Winton said: "The thing is to be prepared always to help other people if there is an opportunity to do so".

The second model was <u>Dr Muhammad Yunus</u>. Janet observed that nobody has made more of an impact on the poor than Dr Yunus with his micro finance bank in Bangladesh in 1977. The Nobel Peace Prize of 2006 was awarded jointly to Dr Yunus and the Grameen Bank "for

their efforts to create economic and social development from



below". She gave a touching example of a destitute Bangladeshi woman who lived on nothing. After learning

how to sign her name, the Bank gave her 300 Taka (\$4.66) with no collateral and with that she started up her own stall selling grain husks. In time she was able to eat three times a day and she even bought a new sari. The finance? It comes from social investment as against traditional investment.

Then Janet widened the picture on <u>Aid</u>. Long term Development Aid is terminated after the disaster or conflict is over. This deserves examination. Some people get a bit upset about Dr Yunus's ideas,

particularly when it comes to talking about charitable giving and the business of international aid money. Charitable giving becomes a way to shrug off responsibility. Janet affirms that charity is no solution to poverty. Charity only perpetuates poverty by taking the initiative away from the poor. Charity allows people to go ahead with their own lives without worrying about the lives of the poor. Charity appeases consciences. Poverty is not a lack of character it is a lack of cash. Gifts are often given with little thought to the negative costs and too much aid can make poverty far more lucrative than honest toil.



Many people think that the more money they give the better they are.

The crucial question is should money be given under any circumstances to

relieve distress? What happens when the money is an encouragement to idleness or vice? A pivotal book for Janet's research is "Dead Aid" by <u>Dambisa Moyo</u>. Moyo argues that the

massive influx of money to Africa, particularly via Celebrity Humanitarians, has done the African people a great injustice. Tyrants love aid!

As can be seen this is a vital and well-proven topic but somewhat rarely publicized. Janet concluded with a few requests/suggestions:

- * TenForTamils (TFT) responds to women applying to receive goods to set up their own business goats, chickens, seed etc.. They are monitored and further supported where necessary. Finance needed.
- * TfT provides scholarships for childrens' education. Finance
- * Go to Kiva.org a micro-lending platform online. Choose a project, lend the money which is repaid when needed. The key to lending is that the same dollar keeps getting used over and over.
- * Kor Timor is a not for profit social enterprise established in 2006 in Dili, Timor Leste, by the Rotary Club of Kew. They produce lovely handcrafts, some of which are used as speaker gifts at some Rotary and Probus Clubs.

The story of last week's visitor, <u>Judy</u> <u>Doubas</u>, is remarkably similar to that of Club Member Joan Roose - they went, they saw, they acted!



Judy formed the idea of <u>Ten for Tamils</u> when she first visited Jaffna, Sri Lanka, in October 2014: "I was not happy with the way our government treated Tamil Asylum Seekers and wanted to know why Tamils would want to flee a country considered the "pearl of the Indian Ocean". Her Sri Lankan visits took her to outback camps for destitute women who at times have no clothes or food. Their children were malnourished and the women living in despair, with little hope for any change in their future.

Judy operates through Sri Lanka's NFP <u>Centre for Women and Development</u> and this day's speaker, Janet, is treasurer to TFT. <u>Ten dollars a month for Tamils</u> <u>www.tenfortamils.org.au</u>
