

VICTORIAN ABORIGINAL CHILD CARE AGENCY - VACCA

VACCA recently moved its' quarters to 340 Bell Street in the Leader



Building. It was a short walk for Paul Ferris and Mark Byrne to the RSL for the meeting. Mark is the Regional Director Client Services and Paul is Program Manager, Aboriginal Led Decision Making Program.

The birth of VACCA

almost 40 years ago is reflected today in the challenging statistic of 1,500 aboriginal children currently in protective care. Overall in Victoria the total is 6,000. Mark stressed the need that these children be cared for in a manner that strengthens connection with culture. His organization is seeking new pathways in settling those in danger, pathways not welfare worker driven while remaining family-based. It is an ambition, a venture that Mark and his team are on.

Paul is from Cairns and has been in Melbourne for 6 years. While early intervention and family services are his forte, the list of departments offered by VACCA is very long and much detailed. Client services stretch from cradle to kinder, pregnancy support, child-placement (at home), response to child sexual abuse

As a summation here follows a quote from VACCA manifesto:

VACCA offers a broad range of services, all of which seek to ensure child safety and wellbeing, promote strong connections to Aboriginal culture, foster Aboriginal child rearing practices and address family issues such as family violence, parent attachment and other issues. Vacca has over 47 programs statewide.

INCOMING CLUB BOARD MEMBERS who recently attended the training session at Benalla reported that it was of value and much was gained from the break-out sessions. In all 320 members from the District attended including 7 from Preston.

Secretary Geoff observed that his President Elect group urged the compliance of members in obtaining a Working With Children Check. This is easily done and is free for volunteers. It is done online (Dept of Justice) and then let Geoff know card number and expiry date.

ROTARY COUNCIL ON LEGISLATION: Every three years Clubs from across the world meet as the Council on Legislation. On 11th April, the Council discussed and passed the following two items described below:

The Council on Legislation approved on Monday two key measures that would give clubs greater flexibility in their meetings and membership. Both were backed by the RI Board of Directors and passed overwhelmingly after lively debate.

The first measure gives clubs greater leeway in when and how often they meet, how often they cancel meetings, and what constitutes a meeting, as long as they meet at least twice a month.

The second measure grants clubs flexibility to experiment with membership models. Proponents argued that clubs need the enhanced freedom in order to determine what works best in their communities, noting that "one size does not fit all."
